The Town of Cowpens held its regular meeting on Tuesday, February 17, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was held later in the month due to the holiday. Present were Mayor Jarred S. Spencer, Mayor Pro-Tem Erin P. Wofford, and Council Members, Lesa C. Bolin, Pam Camp, and Danyelle D. Goode. Mayor Spencer called the meeting to order, and Lesa C. Bolin held prayer.

Pam Camp made a motion to approve the agenda for **February 17, 2026**, seconded by Erin P. Wofford, and carried.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**Bryon Inman – Decorating/Beautification**

Mr. Inman addressed the mayor and town council. **Department Reports**

Steve Bolin presented departmental reports to the town council. The fire department responded to thirty-eight calls during the month of January 2026. Seventeen were in the Town of Cowpens, nine were in the district, four were in the Spartanburg County Mutual Aid district, and eight were in the Cherokee County Mutual Aid district.

The police department issued thirty-three warnings and twenty-three citations during January 2026. Thirteen were for speeding, one for operating uninsured vehicles, three driving under suspension, and five miscellaneous charges. Fines collected totaled \$3,998.09, and the town portion was \$1,505.08.

CC&I conducted re-inspections during the month of January 2026. The property owner of 205 Maple Street was issued a summons, and the court date will be February 24, 2026. No new cases were filed.

Mr. Bolin stated that he had a solution for the issues with the ditches and would provide more details in the future. Bids for mowing Veterans Park will also go out this week.
