

**TOWN OF COWPENS
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
5332 N. Main St.
Monday, March 16, 2026, 6:00 p.m.**

The Town of Cowpens held its regular meeting on Monday, March 16, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Jarred S. Spencer, Mayor Pro-Tem Erin P. Wofford, and Council Members, Lesa C. Bolin, Pam Camp, and Danyelle D. Goode. Mayor Spencer called the meeting to order and held prayer.

Lesla C. Bolin made a motion to approve the agenda for March 16, 2026, seconded by Pam Camp, and carried.

Public Comments

Danyelle D. Goode stated that the Food Truck Takeover was a magnificent event, but she was concerned about the debris being left in the park and liquids being spilled on the benches and the monument. Steve Bolin assured town council that signs would be placed in the park for the next event.

Pam Camp informed town council that she would like to have a “Welcome to The Mighty Moo” banner to place across Palmetto Street during the Mighty Moo Festival.

Approval of Minutes, Purchase Journal, and Bank Statements

The minutes of the February 17, 2026, meeting were presented. Pam Camp made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Danyelle D. Goode, and carried.

The purchase journals for the month of February 2026 were presented to the town council Danyelle D. Goode made a motion to approve the purchase journals as presented, seconded by Pam Camp, and carried.

The bank statements for the month of February 2026 were presented to the town council. Lesa C. Bolin made a motion to approve the bank statements as presented, seconded by Pam Camp, and carried.

Department Reports

Steve Bolin presented departmental reports to the town council. The police department issued forty-one warnings and forty-five citations during February 2026. Twenty-four were for speeding, three for operating uninsured vehicles, three driving under suspension, three failure to exercise due care, served five warrants, and twelve miscellaneous charges. Fines collected totaled \$5,755.82, and the town portion was \$2,037.83.

Mileage for each department for February 2026 was 9,003 for the police department, 1,822 for the fire department, and 588 for the street department.

Steve Bolin recognized and thanked the police, fire, and street departments for their outstanding efforts during the Food Truck Takeover.

OLD BUSINESS

Town Council discussed the following topics during the meeting:

- ❖ Property development on Santee Street (zoned R-2 single and two family residential)
- ❖ Hanging baskets will arrive in approximately two weeks.
- ❖ Banners for America’s 250th Anniversary
- ❖ The street department cleaned the left side of the Cowpens Cemetery. There will be community day March 28th, beginning at 8:00 a.m., to clean the entire area and remove shrubbery.

No action was needed on any of these topics.

NEW BUSINESS

Steve Bolin requested that town council schedule a budget workshop. The budget workshop is scheduled for March 30, 2026. Mr. Bolin is also scheduling a Legacy Day at Veterans Park to spread mulch for the spring season.

Mayor Spencer mentioned that Durant Ashmore, Historian, would be speaking at the depot on April 23, 2026, 7:00 p.m. Mr. Ashmore will be discussing the Battle of Cowpens and The Turning of the Tide.
