

**TOWN OF COWPENS  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
5332 N. Main St.  
Monday, April 20, 2026, 6:00 p.m.**

The Town of Cowpens held its regular meeting on Monday, April 20, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Jarred S. Spencer, Mayor Pro-Tem Erin P. Wofford, and Council Members, Pam Camp, and Danyelle D. Goode. Absent: Lesa C. Bolin. Mayor Spencer called the meeting to order, and Erin P. Wofford held prayer.

Pam Camp made a motion to approve the agenda for April 20, 2026, seconded by Danyelle D. Goode, and carried.

**Public Comments**

Mayor Spencer recognized Phyllis Logan. Ms. Logan questioned if dogs should be allowed at public events. Mayor Spencer and members of town council discussed the question. Service animals are allowed at any event. According to state law animals must be under the control of their handler, typically requiring them to be leashed, harnessed, or tethered. Two questions can be asked about service animals: 1. Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability? 2. What work or task has the dog been trained to perform? After discussion Mayor Spencer stated that he would have our police chief investigate this matter for future events.

**Approval of Minutes, Purchase Journal, and Bank Statements**

The minutes of March 16, 2026, and March 30, 2026, meetings were presented. Pam Camp made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Erin P. Wofford, and carried.

The purchase journals for the month of March 2026 were presented to the town council. Danyelle D. Goode made a motion to approve the purchase journals as presented, seconded by Pam Camp, and carried.

The bank statements for the month of March 2026 were presented to the town council. Danyelle D. Goode made a motion to approve the bank statements as presented, seconded by Pam Camp, and carried.

**Department Reports**

Steve Bolin presented departmental reports to the town council. The police department issued forty-nine warnings and sixty-three citations during March 2026. Thirty were for speeding, six for operating uninsured vehicles, eight driving under suspension, one for drug violations, served nine warrants, and sixteen miscellaneous charges. Fines collected totaled \$4,226.90, and the town portion was \$1,734.12.

Mileage for each department for March 2026 was 7,136 for the police department, 2,413 for the fire department, and 1,019 for the street department.

Mr. Bolin reviewed CC&I Services, LLC progress. He also mentioned that spring cleanup was completed and the town council needs to review the process and have a better plan for the next cleanup period.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**A. Annexation one Parcel Santee St.**

First reading on an ordinance to annex a parcel of land, formerly parcel no. 3-10-00-105.00 and is now a portion of 3-10-00-110, into the town limits of Cowpens. A petition was filed for annexation by the property owner, Igor Savich, of Southern Estates, LLC, a 100% of the owner of the property to be annexed. Pam Camp made a motion to approve the first reading of the ordinance describing petition for annexation under the provisions of SC Code Section 5-3-150 (3), as this would be in the best interest of the property owner. Motion was seconded by Danyelle D. Goode and carried.

**OLD BUSINESS**

**A. REV 250**

Discussion about events for Rev 250 for the remainder of 2026 was discussed. The Cowpens Depot Museum will host an event on April 23, 2026, Turning the Tide at the Cowpens: A Revolutionary Evening in the Tavern. Durant Ashmore will share the story of the Battle of Cowpens and its lasting impact in a relaxed, tavern-style setting. This will be a wonderful way to experience the story of Cowpens in a more personal setting. Mayor Spencer informed everyone that the town will be showing a movie, "The Patriot," on Thursday, May 28, 2026. It will be a relaxing and fun evening for everyone. The Cowpens Mighty Moo Festival will be held June 18-20, 2026. The town hopes to plan more events throughout the remainder of the year.
