

**TOWN OF COWPENS  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
September 18, 2017**

The Town of Cowpens held its regular council meeting on Monday, September 18, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Michael D. Hamrick, Council Members Roy Logan, Jarred S. Spencer, and Thomas Voelker. Absent: Mayor Pro-Tem Brenda J. Adair.

Mayor Hamrick called the meeting to order and Jarred S. Spencer held prayer and included a moment of silence for the families of area residents who had lost loved ones and those who have sickness in their families.

**Approval of Agenda**

Thomas Voelker made a motion to amend the agenda by adding an update from Pam Camp of the Cowpens Mighty Moo Committee and approve the agenda, second by Roy Logan and carried.

Pam Camp updated town council on the events of this year's Mighty Moo Festival and thanked council for their support. Jarred S. Spencer commended the festival committee for their hard work and efforts.

**Approval of Minutes & Financial Statements**

Council discussed the minutes of August 21, 2017. Roy Logan mentioned specific terminology that was used by Jarred S. Spencer and requested that the minutes reflect Mr. Spencer's comments. Teresa Chadwick was instructed to review the recording of the meeting. Thomas Voelker made a motion to continue the approval of the minutes of August 21, 2017 until the next meeting, second by Michael D. Hamrick and carried.

Jarred S. Spencer made a motion to approve the purchase journals, account registers, and monthly bank statements, second by Roy Logan and carried.

**Department Reports**

Steve Bolin asked that Mayor Hamrick open the bids for confiscated vehicles and read them before the town council. Four bids were received. Chester Woodfin submitted the highest bid at \$751.00 for a 1994 Plymouth Van and a 1991 Chevrolet Caprice. Jarred S. Spencer made a motion to accept the highest bid, second by Roy Logan and carried.

Mr. Bolin reported the number of fire calls for the fire department, as well as, mileage for each department. The fire department answered 28 calls for the month of August 2017. Four calls were in the Town, 17 calls in the fire district, five calls were mutual aid in Spartanburg County, and two calls in Cherokee County.

The police department responded to 272 events in August 2017. The top events were motor vehicle accidents, complaints, and traffic stops.
